

Privacy Policy **(Last updated 23rd May 2018)**

Introduction

This Privacy Policy sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you through the website: <https://www.applytobibleschool.com>, or that you provide to us, will be processed by us. This Privacy Policy also sets out your rights to control personal information we hold about you. Please read this Privacy Policy carefully in order to understand our practices regarding your personal data and how we will treat it.

Who we are

Torchbearers International is the 'doing business as' name for "The Torchbearers of the Capernwray Missionary Fellowship", a domestic non-profit corporation registered in California, USA with registration number CO367358, whose registered office is at: PO Box 2620, Estes Park, CO, 80517, USA ("**Torchbearers International**"/"**we**"/"**us**" or "**our**"). We are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy and will only process personal data you provide to us in accordance with applicable privacy laws (e.g. GDPR).

Definitions

"Data controller" - determines the purposes and means of processing personal data and means Torchbearers International in this Privacy Policy;

"Data processor" - is responsible for processing personal data on behalf of a data controller;

"Data subject" - a natural person;

"Personal data" - any information relating to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified in particular by reference to an identifier, for example name, passport number, home address or private email address and online identifiers include IP addresses and cookies;

"Processing" - any operation or set of operations which is performed on personal data or on sets of personal data, whether or not by automated means, such as collection, recording, organisation, structuring, storage, adaptation or alteration, retrieval, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, erasure or destruction;

"Special categories personal data" - the special categories specifically including genetic data, and biometric data where processed to uniquely identify an individual and other examples include racial and ethnic origin, sexual orientation, health data, trade union membership, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs;

"Third party" - a natural or legal person, public authority, agency or body other than the data subject, controller, processor and persons who, under the direct authority of the controller or processor, are authorised to process personal data.

1. If you are under 16

We do not and will not knowingly collect information from any unsupervised minor under the age of 16. If you are under the age of 16, you may not use our website unless you have the consent of, and are supervised by, a parent or guardian.

2. The purpose(s) of processing your personal data

We use your personal data for the following purposes:

- Communicating with students;
- Providing benefits and services to students;
- Furthering our charitable mission;
- Enabling us to achieve our strategic and operational goals.

3. The categories of personal data concerned

With reference to the categories of personal data described in the definitions section, we process the following categories of your data:

Personal data including, without limitation:

- your name, sex and date of birth;
- your postal address;
- your phone and email address;
- where relevant, your parent/guardian and their contact details;
- your personal image (photo);
- your education records;
- your career and employment history;
- your marital status and details of any children;
- your nationality, passport and social security number;

We process **special categories of data** including, without limitation:

- your health, including any disability;
- dietary requirements;
- your ethnic origin;
- your race;
- your religion (including place of worship);
- any criminal offences you have committed;
- your physical and mental health history.

The information we hold is obtained directly from our forms that you have filled in.

4. What is our legal basis for processing your personal data?

a) Personal data

We process your personal data in pursuit of our legitimate interest in fulfilling the purposes set out in Section 3 of this Privacy Policy.

Whilst we rely on legitimate interest as the legal basis for processing, where this is not overridden by the interests and rights or freedoms of the data subjects concerned, we recognise that it is not the only

lawful ground for processing data. As such, where appropriate, Torchbearers International will sometimes process your data on an alternative legal basis – for example, because you have given us consent to do so, or to fulfil contractual obligations we may have when you request services from us.

We may also need to disclose your information to a third party if required by law (for example to government bodies and law enforcement agencies), including for the purposes of investigating a complaint, or if we have your permission to do so.

b) Special categories of personal data

To the extent we process your special categories of personal data, in addition to pursuing our legitimate interest in fulfilling the purposes set out in Section 3 of this Privacy Policy, we have obtained your explicit consent, or it may be necessary for reasons of public interest in the area of public health.

5. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential.

Please note, however, that we may need to disclose your information to a third party if required by law (for example to government bodies and law enforcement agencies) or where we have your permission to do so.

6. How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep your personal data only as long as is necessary for the purpose(s) for which it was collected (unless otherwise advised). Data will be kept securely and destroyed when no longer required. We may also decide to archive some data.

7. Providing us with your personal data

We require you to provide us with your personal data in order for us to fulfil the purposes set out in Section 3 of this Privacy Policy.

8. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under applicable data protection laws, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data:

- The right to request a copy of the personal data which we hold about you;
- The right to request that we correct any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary to retain such data;
- The right to withdraw your consent to the processing of your special categories of personal data at any time, where consent was the lawful basis for processing such data;
- The right to request that we provide you with your personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability), (where applicable i.e. where the processing is based on consent or is necessary for the performance of a contract with the data subject and where the data controller processes the data by automated means);
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of personal data, (where applicable i.e. where processing is based on legitimate interests (or the performance of a task in the public interest/exercise of official authority); direct marketing and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics).

9. Transfer of Data Abroad

All personal information that you submit via the Website is sent to, processed by and stored by a third party data processor outside of the European Union on a secure server located in New Zealand. Your personal information may also be sent to, processed by and stored by other centres that form part of Torchbearers International, in connection with the purposes set out in Section 3 of this Privacy Policy. Please be aware that not all countries offer the same level of data protection as your home country, although our collection, storage and use of your personal data will continue to be governed by this Privacy Policy.

10. Links

Our website contains links to other websites operated by third parties. Please note that this Privacy Policy applies only to the personal information that we collect and we cannot be responsible for personal information that third parties may collect, store and use through their website. You should always read the Privacy Policy of each website you visit carefully.

11. Cookies

Cookies are widely used to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site by placing small text files on your computer when you visit the website.

You may change your website browser settings to reject cookies, although please note that if you do this it may impair the functionality of our website. For further information about cookies, including how to refuse cookies, please visit www.allaboutcookies.org.

12. Online Application Forms

Third-party provider: CubeMedia

We use third-party providers to collect data on our behalf if you are attending a Torchbearers International Bible School. This third-party provider is a data processor for us and only process personal information in accordance with our instructions.

13. Social Media

Third-party providers, including: Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Vimeo and YouTube.

If you send us a private or direct message via social media, the message will be stored by a third-party provider. However, we will not share this with any other organisations.

14. Emails

We monitor any emails sent to us for viruses or malicious software, including file attachments. Please be aware that you have a responsibility to ensure that any email you send is within the confines of the law.

15. Security and Performance

We use a third-party service to assist in maintaining the security and performance of our website, which requires the processing of website user's IP addresses to do so. Whilst we take appropriate technical and organisational measures to safeguard the personal information that you provide to us, no transmission over the Internet can ever be guaranteed secure. Consequently, please note that we cannot guarantee the security of any personal information that you transfer over the Internet to us.

16. Automated Decision Making

We do not use any form of automated decision making.

17. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose not covered by this Privacy Policy, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions.

18. Changes to our Privacy Policy

Please check back regularly to keep informed of updates to this Privacy Policy as you will be deemed to have accepted any changes if you continue to use our website after an update has been posted.

19. How to make a complaint

We endeavour to meet the highest standards when collecting and using personal information. For this reason, we take any complaints we receive about this very seriously and encourage individuals to bring it to our attention if they think that our collection or use of information is unfair, misleading or inappropriate, and welcome any suggestions for improving our procedures.
